## Requirements >>>

Some boards and commissions have requirements for the makeup of members including age, profession, residency or background. This is to ensure that each demographic of the community is fairly represented. This can extend to including members who live in the greater Kingman area, but do not

reside inside city limits. However, the majority of Board and Commission members must reside within city limits and all must be registered voters.

Additional qualities effective members must possess include a commitment to attend meetings, a willingness to read and evaluate written documents and the ability to set aside personal feelings and beliefs in order to decide what is best for the community as a whole.
