Coffee with Cops February 21st


Kingman Police Department will be holding a Coffee with Cops event February 21st, from 11:00 AM to 2:00 PM at the Kingman Police Department front parking lot.

Users can also access a crime mapping tool that will designate types of crimes in certain portions of our city. Mobile App users can also communicate with the Kingman Police Department through the application.

The best groups are started by a concerned citizen that is willing to take some ownership of the area of Kingman they reside.
